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CITIZEN CHARTER 2025 – 2026

INFORMATION OF THE GENERAL PUBLIC)

BACKWARD CLASSES, MOST BACKWARD CLASSES AND MINORITIES WELFARE DEPARTMENT

Introduction

In Tamil Nadu, approximately 68% of the total population belongs to Backward Classes (BC), Most Backward Classes (MBC), and Denotified Communities (DNC). To ensure social, educational, and economic progress for these communities, various welfare schemes are being implemented by this department.

For public awareness, details of schemes implemented for the development of Backward Classes, Most Backward Classes, Denotified Communities and Minority communities, along with eligibility criteria and the officials concerned, have been provided in the Citizen Charter.

2. Reservation

Tamil Nadu implements the 69% reservation system, with the allocation as follows:-

Category	Percentage
Backward Classes (BC)	26.5%
Backward Class Muslims (BCM)	3.5%
Most Backward Classes & Denotified Communities (MBC & DNC)	20%
Scheduled Castes (SC)	18%
Scheduled Tribes (ST)	1%

Tamil Nadu is implementing the reservation policy since 1921. The percentage of the reservation was increased periodically and the current reservation of 69% is in effect since 1990. This policy promotes education and employment opportunities, enabling social and economic advancement for the reserved categories.

The list of Backward Classes, Backward Class Muslims, Most Backward Classes, and Denotified Communities are furnished in the Table-I of this Citizen Charter.

3. Educational Development

Education serves as a foundation for the overall development of the society. To promote the educational advancement of Backward Classes (BC), Most Backward Classes (MBC), Denotified Communities (DNC) and Minorities, the State Government has introduced numerous schemes. While reservation policy facilitates access to educational institutions for these communities. The scholarship schemes provide financial assistance enabling them to pursue education.

Hostels

To ensure seamless of education of students belonging to Backward Classes, Most Backward Classes, Denotified Communities, and Minorities free hostels with food and accommodation are provided near the educational institutions for school and college students.

Eligibility Criteria

School Hostels

1. Students from Classes 4 to 12 are eligible.
2. The annual income of the parents must not exceed ₹2,00,000.
3. The Student's residence must be more than 8 km away from the educational institution (This condition does not apply to female students).

College Hostels

1. Students pursuing vocational training, diploma, undergraduate, and postgraduate courses are eligible.
2. Parents' annual income must not exceed ₹2,00,000.
3. Student's residence must be more than 8 km away from the educational institution (This condition does not apply to female students).

Admission Process

- Students applying to Backward Classes, Most Backward Classes, Denotified Communities Welfare Hostels can submit their parental annual income and community certificates after being admitted, rather than at the time of submitting applications.
- If all allocated hostel slots are filled, 20% additional seats can be adjusted within vacant slots in other hostels in the district.
- If more seats are needed, District Collectors can approve 10% additional admissions beyond the sanctioned seats.
- If further admissions are required, the Department Heads have authority to enroll an additional 2,102 students, considering available infrastructure.

Special Reservations

- 4% of seats are allotted in each hostels for differently abled students.
- 5 seats are allotted additionally for children of Sri Lankan Tamil refugees residing in camps.
- Rescued child labourers can be admitted at any time, without restrictions, and allowed to stay in hostels until completing their studies.
- Children of migrant labourers from Tamil Nadu working in Kerala border plantations are exempt from submitting caste and income certificates. Instead, they can be enrolled in BC, MBC & DNC hostels in Theni district with a self-declaration certificate from their parents.

V. Egg / Banana (School & College Hostels)

- 5 eggs per week (20 eggs per student per month).
- Students who do not eat eggs are provided with one banana instead.

VI. Special Festive Meals

i) BC, MBC / DNC Hostels

In BC, MBC /DNC Hostels students are provided special festive meals on Pongal Festival, Republic Day, Tamil New Year, Independence Day and Diwali Festival.

ii) Minorities Hostels

In Minorities Hostels Students provided with special festive meals on important days such as Republic Day, Tamil New Year, Independence Day and additionally on any of the two Minorities Festivals namely Ramadan, Christmas, Bakrid, Mahavir Jayanti, and Buddha Purnima.

VII. Evening Snacks (School & College Hostels)

- Daily evening snacks including boiled pulses (sundal) and sukku malli coffee or karuppatti tea.

The food charges have been revised and enhanced as per the following G.O's under:

- G.O. No. 80, Backward Classes, Most Backward Classes, and Minorities Welfare Department, dated 15.11.2023.
- G.O. No. 13, Backward Classes, Most Backward Classes, and Minorities Welfare Department, dated 23.01.2024.

Facilities Provided for Hostel Students' Welfare

1. Newspapers - Each hostel receives two Tamil newspapers and one English newspaper daily to know current events.
2. Career Guidance Programs – Awareness sessions for standard 10, 12, and final-year college students to help them explore job opportunities. Conducted annually by the Employment & Training Department.
3. Competitions & Cultural Fest – Essay writing and sports competitions are held in the name of “Kalai Thiruvizha” for school and college students.
4. Free Study Guides – Tamil Nadu Textbook & Educational Services Corporation provides printed study guides for standard 10 & 12 hostel students to help them excel in board exams.
5. Question Bank Books – Tamil Nadu State Parent-Teacher Association distributes question bank books to improve academic performance for standard 10 & 12 hostel students.
6. NEET/JEE Preparation Materials – From 2024-25, hostel students completing standard 12 will receive printed question bank books for NEET/JEE entrance exams.
7. Kitchen Equipment – In 2024-25, 277 college hostels received new cooking utensils, at a cost of ₹50,000 per hostel.
8. Free Textbooks – All school textbooks up to standard 12 are provided free of cost by the School Education Department.
9. Free Uniforms – Since 2013-14, hostel students of standard 4 to 10 receive four sets stitched uniforms, similar to those provided under the Noon-meal Program.
10. Sports Equipments – From the year 2024-25 sports equipments are provided to school hostels.
11. Library & Other Amenities – Hostels are equipped with library books, e-library, color TVs, sports gear, water purifiers, book racks, grinding machines, steam cookers, electric grinders, sanitary napkin

incinerators, fire extinguishers, idli steamers, and pest control devices. College hostels additionally receive inverter systems, reference books, and bunk beds.

12. Dining Essentials – New hostels receive stainless steel plates and tumblers. Hostel students in hilly areas like Ooty and Kodaikanal receive blankets. Additional items provided as follows:-
 - a. School hostel students receive mats every year.
 - b. First-year college students receive blankets.
 - c. All hostel students receive bedsheet once in two years.
13. Medical Check-ups – Three medical camps are conducted annually for the welfare of the hostel students.
14. Geysers in Hilly Region Hostels – Hostels in Ooty and Kodaikanal are equipped with geysers for students' well-being.

Food Subsidy for Hostel Students

Scholarship Schemes:-

I. Scholarship Schemes Fully Funded by the State Government

1. School Education Scholarship Scheme

- Students studying in government and government-aided schools through Tamil-medium education from standard 1 to 10 are fully exempted from all fees (tuition fees, special fees, and exam fees).
- Additionally, English-medium students in standard 10 are exempted from tuition fees.

Exam Fee Concession

- Under the School Education Scholarship Scheme, the exam fees for standard 10 students studying in English-medium government and government-aided schools, belonging to Backward Classes, Most Backward Classes, and Denotified Communities, are covered by the State Government and reimbursed to the Directorate of Government Examinations.

Eligibility Conditions:

- Backward Classes – Parents' annual income must not exceed Rs.2,50,000/-.
- Most Backward Classes & Denotified Communities – No income restrictions.

2. Higher Secondary Education Scholarship Scheme (11th & 12th Standard)

- Students studying in Tamil-medium government and government-aided schools in 11th and 12th standard are completely exempted from all fees (tuition fees, special fees, and exam fees).
- Additionally, English-medium students in standard 11 and 12 are exempted from tuition fees.

Exam Fee Concession

- Under the Higher Secondary School Education Scholarship Scheme, the exam fees for standard 11th and 12th students studying in English-medium government and government-aided schools, belonging to Backward Classes, Most Backward Classes, and Denotified Communities, are covered by the State Government and reimbursed to the Directorate of Government Examinations.

Eligibility Conditions:

1. Backward Classes – Parents' annual income must not exceed Rs.2,50,000/-.
2. Most Backward Classes & Denotified Communities – No income restrictions.

3. Educational Incentive Scheme for Rural Girl Children

(Applicable only for Most Backward Classes / Denotified Communities)

This scheme is implemented in all districts except Chennai.

4. Fee Reimbursement for Medical Students Under the 7.5% Reservation Quota

BC, MBC, DNC & OC Students who studied in government schools and admitted to medical and dental courses under the 7.5% reservation quota are eligible for fee reimbursement. The Backward Classes Welfare Directorate reimburses their tuition fees to the Directorate of Medical Education.

5. Scholarship Scheme for Students in Union Government Educational Institutions

Students belonging to Backward Classes, Most Backward Classes, and Denotified Communities studying undergraduate and postgraduate degrees in IITs, IIMs, IIITs, NITs, and Central Universities receive financial assistance subject to the following conditions:

Eligibility Criteria:

1. Must belong to BC, MBC, or DNC categories.
2. Must be a resident of Tamil Nadu.
3. Must be studying in IITs, IIMs, IIITs, NITs, or Central Universities.
4. Parents' annual income must not exceed Rs.2.50 lakhs.
5. The scholarship is granted every year for the full course duration.
6. Covers tuition fees, special fees, exam fees, and other mandatory fees, up to Rs.2.00 lakhs per year, whichever is less.
7. If applications exceeds the limit, selection will be based on academic performance in +2 board exams.
8. The Students enrolled in integrated courses are also eligible.

Application Process:

Students must fill up the scholarship application and submit it with fee receipts to their respective institution. The institution verify and recommend and sent for eligible BC students to the Backward Classes Welfare Commissioner (Serial No. 1 in the schedule) and MBC/DNC students to the Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities Welfare Commissioner (Serial No. 2 in the schedule) separately.

II. Centrally Sponsored Scholarship Schemes:

1. PM-YASASVI Pre-Matric Scholarship for OBC, EBC and DNT Students.

(Funding Ratio: 60% Union Government | 40% State Government)

Under the PM-YASASVI Pre-Matric Scholarship Scheme, from the academic year 2022-2023, girl students belonging to Backward Classes, Most Backward Classes, and Denotified Communities studying in 9th and 10th standard in government schools receive the annual scholarship of Rs.4,000/- which is directly deposited into their bank accounts.

Eligibility Conditions:

- Parents' annual income must not exceed Rs. 2.50 lakhs.

2. PM-YASASVI Post-Matric Scholarship for OBC, EBC & DNT Students

(Funding Ratio: 60% Union Government | 40% State Government)

Under the Post-Matric Scholarship Scheme, students belonging to Backward Classes (BC), Most Backward Classes (MBC), and Denotified Communities (DNC) pursuing higher education receive financial assistance.

I. Free Education Assistance

A) Undergraduate Degree

- BC, MBC, and DNC students studying in three-year undergraduate course in government and government-aided arts & science colleges receive:
 - Waiver on tuition fees.
 - Government-approved special and non-refundable mandatory fees.
 - Full reimbursement of exam fees and reimbursement of book fees as notified in scholarship notification.
 - Hostel and mess fee of Rs.4,000 per year (Rs.400 per month for 10 months) for students staying in institution-affiliated hostels (effective from 2021-22).

Eligibility: No conditions.

B) Diploma

- BC, MBC, and DNC students pursuing diploma courses in government and government-aided polytechnic colleges receive:
 - Government-approved special and non-refundable mandatory fees.
 - Waiver on tuition fees for students in government-aided polytechnic colleges.
 - Full reimbursement of exam fees and reimbursement of book fees as notified in scholarship notification.
 - Hostel and mess fee of Rs.4,000 per year (Rs.400 per month for 10 months) for students staying in institution-affiliated hostels (effective from 2021-22).

Eligibility Conditions:

1. Parents' annual income must not exceed Rs.2,50,000/-.
2. Student must be the first diploma/degree holder in their family.

C) Free Technical Education

- BC, MBC, and DNC students selected for technical education under government quota in government, government-aided, and self-financed colleges receive:
 - Government-approved special and non-refundable mandatory fees.
 - Full reimbursement of exam fees and reimbursement of book fees as notified in scholarship notification.
 - Hostel and mess fee of Rs.4,000 per year (Rs.400 per month for 10 months) for students staying in institution-affiliated hostels (effective from 2021-22).

Eligibility Conditions:

1. Parents' annual income must not exceed Rs.2,50,000/-.
2. Student must be the first graduate in their family.

II) General Post-Matric Scholarship

Students who have not availed the above three schemes will receive financial assistance under this scheme.

- Applies to students who are not first graduate in their family and studying in Government, Government-aided, and Government-quota self-finance colleges pursuing diploma, postgraduate, technical education, and research degrees.

- Covers tuition fees, special fees, book fees, and full exam fees.
- Evening shift students in Government and Government-aided colleges receive financial aid under the same conditions on par with morning shift students.
- Hostel and mess fee of Rs.4,000/- per year (Rs.400 per month for 10 months) for students staying in institution-affiliated hostels (effective from 2021-22).

Eligibility Condition: Parents' annual income must not exceed Rs.2,50,000.

Application Process for Scholarship

From 2024-2025, students belonging to BC, MBC, and DNC categories must register their Aadhaar number and UMIS number on the Unified State Scholarship Portal (USSP) at <https://umis.tn.gov.in>.

The scholarship amount is directly transferred (ECS) into the students' Aadhaar-linked bank account through the Public Financial Management System (PFMS), managed by the Head Offices of the BC, MBC, and DNC Welfare Department.

III. Union Government-Funded Scholarship Scheme (100% Central Government Funding)

PM YASASVI – Central Sector Scheme of Top-Class Education in Schools for OBC, EBC, and DNT Students

Under the 100% centrally funded, PM-YASASVI Top-Class Education Scheme was implemented from 2022-2023 for students belonging to Other Backward Classes (OBC), Economically Backward Classes (EBC), and Denotified Tribes (DNTs) studying in top-ranked schools.

- 9th & 10th standard students receive a maximum annual scholarship of Rs.75,000/- covering tuition fees, hostel fees, and other charges.
- 11th & 12th standard students receive a maximum annual scholarship of Rs.1,25,000, covering tuition fees, hostel fees, and other charges.
- Eligible students must apply via the National Scholarship Portal (NSP) for schools listed by the Union Government.

Eligibility Conditions:

- Parents' annual income must not exceed Rs.2.50 lakhs.
- The students can contact the District Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare Offices in their respective District Collector's Office. (For doubts regarding scholarship details).

Bicycle Distribution Scheme**Scheme Details:**

- Bicycles are provided to all 11th standard students studying in Government, Government-aided, and partially Government-funded schools, regardless of income or caste.
- This benefit is also extended to students eligible for free bus travel passes.
- Students residing in hostels within school campus and residential school students are NOT eligible for bicycles under the scheme.

Kallar Reclamation Schools

To improve the educational status of the Piramalai Kallar community, 299 Kallar Reclamation Schools are functioning in Madurai, Theni, and Dindigul districts under the direct administration of the Joint Director of Kallar Reclamation, Madurai.

Benefits for Students in Kallar Reclamation Schools

- School Education Department provides scholarships, textbooks, notebooks, uniforms, footwear, school bags, mathematical instrument boxes, color pencils, and world atlas books, similar to students in government and government-aided schools.
- Smart classrooms have been installed in Kallar Reclamation High Schools & Higher Secondary Schools.
- In Madurai, Theni, and Dindigul districts, English-medium education is offered from LKG to Grade 11 in Kallar Reclamation Schools. 1,335 students are currently enrolled in English-medium classes (2024-25 academic year).

Residential Schools (Hostel Facilities)

- Four residential schools operate in Madurai, Theni, and Dindigul districts, catering to Grades 6 to 8.
- These schools focus on holistic development through programs like Abacus, Yoga, Meditation, Music Training, Vocational Training, and Skill Development Workshops under the "Mirror Program."
- Students receive uniforms, clothes, Oxford English dictionaries, school bags, ties, belts, shoes, plates, tumblers, buckets, mugs, trunks, towels, blankets, and sleeping mats.

Teacher Incentives

- High school & higher secondary school headmasters ensuring 95% or higher board exam pass rates receive a ₹10,000 cash award and a certificate of appreciation.
- Postgraduate & graduate teachers achieving 100% pass rates in their respective subjects receive a ₹5,000 cash award.

4. Economic Development Schemes

To improve the economic status of BC, MBC, and DNC communities, brass laundry tubs powered by LPG and motorized sewing machines are provided.

Brass Laundry Iron Box and LPG-Powered Iron Box

Eligibility Conditions:

- Must belong to BC, MBC, or DNC categories and be engaged in the laundry profession.
- Annual family income limit: ₹1,00,000.
- Minimum age requirement: 20 years or above.

Establishment of Modern Laundry Units

Eligibility Conditions:

- Group members must belong to BC, MBC, or DNC categories.
- Each group must consist of 10 members engaged in the laundry profession.
- Annual income of each member must not exceed ₹1,00,000.
- Minimum age requirement: 20 years.
- Each group receives ₹3 lakhs to establish a modern laundry unit.

Distribution of Motorized Sewing Machines

Eligibility Conditions:

- Applicants must belong to BC, MBC, or DNC categories.
- Annual income must not exceed ₹1,00,000.
- Must have sewing experience or training.
- Age limit: 20 to 45 years.
- Priority is given to widows and abandoned women.
- Both men and women are eligible to apply.
- Beneficiaries who have availed this scheme previously can reapply only after 7 years.

10. Thanthai Periyar Award for Social Justice

11. Tamil Nadu Backward Classes Commission

Constitution of the Commission

The Tamil Nadu Backward Classes Commission, constituted as a permanent body under Article 16(4) read with Article 340 of the Constitution of India and functions from 15.03.1993 onwards, under the Chairmanship of a retired Judge of High Court.

The Commission was reconstituted with effect from 17.11.2022, with tenure of three years under the Chairmanship of Former Judge of the High Court Justice Mr.V. Bharathidasan.

Functions of the Commission

The Terms of Reference issued to the Tamil Nadu Backward Classes Commission are:-

- (i) The Commission shall entertain, examine and recommend upon requests for inclusion and complaints of over-inclusion and under-inclusion in the lists of Backward Classes / Most Backward Classes.
- (ii) Periodic revision of list of Backward Classes and Most Backward Classes in this State as and when decided.
- (iii) The Commission shall make recommendations on improved reservation for Christians, Muslims and other Minorities based on their social and educational backwardness.
- (iv) The Commission shall submit reports for classification and sub-classification of Backward Classes, Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities in light of the provisions of the Constitution of India and various decisions of the Supreme Court bearing on the subject.
- (v) The Commission shall undertake suitable exercise through independent studies and assessment for collecting pertinent, contemporaneous data relating to the Backward Classes, Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities, currently notified by the State, for the purpose of examination of demands of various communities and make its recommendation to the Government.

- (vi) The Commission shall examine and make recommendations on any other matter relating to Backward Classes that may be referred to it by Government from time to time.

As per the additional Term of Reference issued on 12.1.2023, the Commission shall examine the demands for internal reservation within the Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities in the light of observations made by the Supreme Court in its judgement dated 31.3.2022 in C.A.No.2600 of 2022 in particular with reference to paragraphs 68 and 73 thereof and to furnish report to the Government. Time limit for furnishing report has been extended upto 11.7.2025.

Denotified Communities Welfare Board

- The Denotified Communities Welfare Board was established in 2007 by the Tamil Nadu government to support the social, educational, and economic development of denotified communities.
- In G.O. No. 83 (Backward Classes, Most Backward Classes, and Minorities Welfare Department, dated 24.11.2023), the Welfare Board has been restructured under the leadership of the Honorable Minister for Backward Classes Welfare.
- Registered members receive welfare benefits similar to those provided to unorganized workers under the Department of Labour Welfare and Skill Development.
- These benefits include:
 - Accident relief
 - Educational scholarships
 - Marriage assistance
 - Maternity benefits
 - Old-age pension

Eligibility for Registration:

- Individuals belonging to denotified communities.
- Age between 18 and 60 years.

Government Allocation:

- ₹250 lakhs have been allocated for the Welfare Board so far.

Application Process:

To avail these benefits, eligible individuals must submit completed application forms with necessary documents to their respective District Backward Classes & Minorities Welfare Offices.

Tamil Nadu Vanniyakula Kshatriya Public Charitable Trusts and Endowments Board.

The Government established "Vanniyar Public Property Welfare Board" during the year 2009 to identify charitable trusts created by Vanniyar philanthropists and to find out ways and means to ensure the fulfillment of objects of the trusts and to ensure that the benefits reach the intended sections.

In order to fulfil the testator's wishes and to provide protection and maintenance of the public charitable trusts and endowments created and administered by the persons or organization of Vanniyar Kshatriya Community in this State, the Tamil Nadu Vanniyakula Kshatriya Public Charitable Trusts and Endowments [Protection and Maintenance] Act, 2018 was enacted and it came into force on 04.02.2019.

To enforce this Act, the Government have constituted "The Tamil Nadu Vanniyarkula Kshatriya Public Charitable Trusts and Endowments Board" consisting of Chairperson, 12 Members includes 2 Ex-Officio Members and Member- Secretary. The Board has identified 126 Trusts, till now. These trusts are located in 27 districts. Out of the identified trusts, so far, totally 91 trusts were registered with this Board. Action is being taken to register the remaining trusts with the Board.

The Board published the list of properties belonging to 49 Vanniyakula Kshatriya Public Charitable Trusts/Endowments in the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette till date and 4 Trusts/Endowments are under process for the Publication in the Gazette. Action is also being taken by the Board to publish the remaining Trusts.

14. Minorities Welfare

To improve the socio-economic and educational status of minorities and to protect their Constitutional and legal rights, to implement the recommendations of the Justice Rajindar Sachar Committee, to monitor the implementation of the Prime Minister's New 15 Point Programme and to implement various welfare schemes, the Government of Tamil Nadu created "Directorate of Minorities Welfare" in the year 2007. The State Minorities Commission was formed in the year 1989 to protect the rights and welfare of the Religious and Linguistic Minorities and Tamil Nadu Minorities Economic Development Corporation (TAMCO) was formed in the year 1999 to eradicate the penurious status and improve the economic status of the Minorities.

State and District Administration

To implement minorities welfare schemes, posts have been created in Directorate of Minorities Welfare and in District Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare Office functioning in the Collectorate in all districts. For welfare of minorities, District Minorities Welfare Offices with new posts have been established exclusively in 5 Minorities concentrated districts viz., Chennai, Vellore, Villupuram, Tirunelveli and Coimbatore.

Separate Reservation

The Government enacted the Act providing 3.5% separate reservation to Backward Class Muslims out of the 30% reservation earmarked for BC in the year 2007. The Act is being implemented since 15.09.2007. Further, the Government have ordered to follow the carry forward procedure in filling up of posts earmarked for Backward Class Muslims in direct recruitments.

Scholarships

The Pre-Metric Scholarship scheme for Minorities was introduced by the Union Government was being implemented for students studying from 1st standard to 10th standard.

The scheme has been discontinued by the Union Government from the year 2022-2023 as per the Right to Education Act, 2009 (Free and Compulsory Education for all children at primary level) for the minority students studying from 1st standard to 8th standard. As a result, the poor and minority students could not get scholarships. Therefore, the Government of Tamil Nadu has sanctioned a sum of Rs.12,16,98,000/- (EMIS Data) to provide scholarship of Rs.1,000/- each to 1,21,698 Muslim girls studying in Government and Government aided schools from 1st standard to 8th standard during the financial year 2024-2025 and the scheme is implementing through Wakf Board.

Minority Hostels

To enable the minority students to continue their education without any impediments 11 Minority Hostels (11 College Hostel, 5 School cum College Hostel and 4 School Hostel) are functioning in the following places with free boarding, lodging and various other amenities. The details of Hostels are furnished in Table – II (b)

Muslim Women Aid Society

To help the destitute Muslim widows by paying monthly allowances, a society was started in Chennai in the name "Mohammadan Gosha Widows Aid Charity" on 01.10.1892 by the Nawab of Carnatic. Subsequently, the name was changed into "Muslim Women Aid Society". This Society was registered under the Societies Registration Act on 12.08.1976 and functioning under the chairmanship of District Collector, Chennai.

Muslim Women Aid Societies have been established in all the District Headquarters of the State in the year 2007 and the Project Officer Women Development (DRDA) as Ex-Officio vice President, District Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare Officer as Convener, one Honorary Secretary, two Honorary Joint Secretaries and three other members from prominent and Local Muslim nominated by the District Collector and there after elected by the

members in the General Body Meeting. A seed money of Rs.1.00 lakh has been provided to each society.

Based on need 13, additional Muslim Women Aid Societies have been formed. Now, 51 Muslim Women Aid Societies are functioning through out Tamil Nadu.

Twice the amount of donation collected by each Society is sanctioned as matching grant subject to a maximum of Rs.20/- lakh per year at the ratio of 1:2 w.e.f 01.04.2012.

The Objectives of the Society

- ❖ Financial assistance is being provided through the financial resources of these associations to help destitute elderly Muslim widows and Muslim women living in extreme poverty.
- ❖ Assistance and Need Based trainings like Tailoring, Embroidery, Footwear manufacturing, Handicrafts are provided to uplift the livelihood Muslim women of destitute, elderly.
- ❖ To help very poor Muslim Women to avail grants /concessions which are available in other State / Central Government schemes and thereby improve their livelihood. Recommending to get shelter through Government Scheme for destitute muslim widows and elderly muslim women.
- ❖ To form Self Help Groups, impart them training and extend Micro Finance loan to needy women beneficiaries for starting petty trades through Tamil Nadu Minorities Economic Development Corporation (TAMCO) schemes.
- ❖ Assisting Muslim Woman Members in Business Industry and education to enable them to excel in that field.
- ❖ Generally Society can provide assistance to poor Muslim women for their education and economic development if they deserve.

Destitute, poor Muslim women those want to avail benefit under the above scheme can apply to District Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare Officer / District Minorities Welfare Officer functioning in District Collectorate.

Christian Women aid Society

Like Muslim Women Aid Societies, in order to provide assistance to the poor destitute and aged Christian Women, District Christian Women Aid Societies have been formed in all the district Head quarters headed by the District Collector as Ex-Officio Chairman. A seed money of Rs.1.00 lakh has been given to each society.

Also, based on need, additional one Christian Women Aid Society is functioning in 5 districts viz.Karur, Madurai,Theni, Tiruvallur and Sivagangai.

Twice the amount of donation collected by each society is sanctioned as matching grant by the Government at the ratio of 1:2 up to the maximum of Rs.20 lakh per annum to each society from the inception.

Destitute, poor Christian women who want to avail benefit under the above scheme can apply to the District Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare Officer / District Minorities Welfare Officer functioning in the District Collectorate.

Subsidy for purchase of two-wheelers for Ulemas

Under this scheme, Ulemas working in 2814 Waqf Institutions registered under Tamil Nadu Waqf Board will be given subsidy to procure new two-wheeler.

A subsidy of Rs. 25,000/- or 50% of the cost of the vehicle whichever is less is sanctioned so as enable them to carry out their duties efficiently and smoothly.

The beneficiary is not entitled to sell or transfer the vehicle for a minimum period of 5 years.

Eligibility to benefit under this Scheme.

- A) The applicant should have worked for at least 5 years in Waqf institution registered under Waqf Board on the day of submitting application.

- B) Must be from Tamil Nadu.
- C) Must be between 18 to 45 years of age.
- D) Must have Learners Licence Registration (LLR)/driving licence at the time of applying.
- E) In the registered Waqf Institutions, if more than one person applies for subsidy it will be sanctioned to one person on priority in the order of 1.Pesh Imam 2.Arabic Teachers 3.Mothinar 4.Mujawar.

Supply of Motorized Sewing Machines to Minorities Women

For the benefit of poverty-stricken minorities women, free motorized sewing machines are provided.

Under this scheme, sewing machines are provided to the Minorities women subject to the following conditions:

1. Should possess certificate of Tailoring skills.
2. The annual income ceiling is Rs.1.00 lakh.
3. Must be between 20 to 45 years of age.
4. Preference will be given to Destitute Widows.
5. Those who already availed the benefit under this scheme shall also apply after completion of 7 years.
6. Under this scheme, individual should submit application to concerned District Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare Officer and Based on eligibility and priority, sewing machines will be provided after Completion of training conducted by TNSDC on priority basis.

Financial Assistance for Jerusalem Pilgrimage

The Government is implementing a scheme of providing financial assistance to undertake Pilgrimage to Jerusalem for all denomination of Christians. Under the scheme 600 Christians may avail financial assistance to undertake pilgrimage every year including 50 Nuns/Sisters.

The Tour Itinerary covers Bethlehem, Jerusalem, Nazareth, Jordan River, Sea of calilee and other Biblical places. The financial assistance to each Nun/Sister has been increased to Rs.60,000/- and for others to Rs.37,000/-. In G.O(Ms)No. 09, Backward Classes, Most Backward Classes and Minorities

Welfare Department, dated 20.01.2024, the guidelines of this scheme has been revised and converted as subsidy sanction scheme to the beneficiaries through ECS with existing procedures.

Conditions and Certificates to be submitted with application

1. The applicant / applicant's family should be a Christian resident of Tamil Nadu.
2. Preference will be given to the applicants who have completed 70 years of age.
3. While undertaking pilgrimage applicants should not engage in any illegal activity in abroad.
4. The applicant should submit proof of being a Christian / Nun / Sister.
5. Copy of passport and copies of immigration stamped pages during pilgrimage to Israel / Jordan / Egypt
6. Visa copy
7. All Bus / Train / Flight tickets and all flight Boarding passes for journeys including Bethlehem and Jerusalem, Nazareth, the Jordan River, the Sea of Galilee and Other associated holy places of Christianity for the entire journey.
8. Tour Itinerary
9. Pilgrimage Completion Certificate
10. Copy of Aadhaar Card
11. Copy of first page of applicant's bank savings account book
(Applicant Name, Address, Account Number, Bank Name, Branch, IFSC Code, MICR Code with details).
12. 3 photographs.
13. Income certificate

Financial assistance for Nagpur Deeksha Pilgrimage

In 2024-25, financial assistance of Rs.7.72 lakh was provided as transportation charges to 140 Buddhists who participate in the Dhamma Chakra Parivardhana festival held on Vijayadashami at Nagpur Deeksha Bhoomi.

Financial assistance for Repairs and Renovation of Churches

The Government have introduced a scheme of providing financial assistance for Repairs and Renovation of Churches in Tamil Nadu during the year 2016-17 subject to the following conditions:-

- ❖ Church should be registered and functioning in own building with minimum period of 10 years.
- ❖ Financial assistance to a maximum of Rs.20.00 lakh will be sanctioned considering the age and damage of the churches.
- ❖ Under this scheme, financial assistance is sanctioned for provision of Altar, construction of toilets for the visitors, provision of drinking water facilities, construction of compound wall, provision of ambo, micset, loudspeaker, tabernacle and altar, monstrance, statues, candle stands, pews for the devotees to sit and kneel etc.,
- ❖ No financial support should be received from the foreign countries to this effect.
- ❖ The damages will be assessed by the Committee constituted by the District Collector and shall recommend to the HOD for sanction of Subsidy after scrutinizing the Plan Estimates, Approved Plan and Age of the Church building etc.
- ❖ The funds will be released in two installments in the ratio of 75:25 on the basis of the recommendation of the District Collector.

Application form requesting financial assistance for Church Renovation should be submitted to District Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare Officer/District Minorities Welfare Officer along with following documents.

1. Application form.
2. Proof of non-receipt of financial assistance from foreign countries.
3. Church registration certificate, certificate obtained from Government Local bodies if the church is functioning independently.

4. Estimate obtained from Government Approved Engineer, drawing and stability certificate of Church building.
5. Copy of bank account details in Church name.
6. Photos of the area to be repaired / renovated.

Renovation of Heritage Churches

In Tamilnadu under the scheme of renovation of heritage Churches Rs.6.00 crore sanctioned to renovate Wesley Church, Chennai, St. Thomas Mount National Shrine, Chengalpattu, St. Xavier Church, Kanniyakumari and Caldwell Parsonage, Tirunelveli and Rs.3.00 crore has been released and works are under progress.

Further, for the year 2023-24, the grant had been enhanced to Rs. 10 Crore and for an amount of Rs. 1.55 Crore sanctioned to St. George's Church, Madurai out of which 50 % amount of Rs. 0.78 Crore released to the Church under this scheme.

In the year 2024-25 announcement has been made and fund sanctioned to the following Heritage churches for repair and renovation work.

1. An amount of Rs. 4.02 Crore sanctioned to St. Paul's Church, Choolai, Chennai out of which 50 % amount i.e, Rs. 2.01 Crore released to Church.
2. An amount of Rs.1.33 Crore sanctioned to St. Antony's Church, Viruthachalam, Cuddalore out of which 50 % amount i.e, Rs. 0.67 Crore released to Church.
3. An amount of Rs.1.55 Crore sanctioned to Heart of Jesus Church, Idaikattur, Sivagangai out of which 50 % amount i.e, Rs. 0.78 Crore released to this Church.

So, far Rs. 14.45 Crore has been sanctioned under this scheme.

Formation of Kabarsthan and Burial Ground

In G.O. (Ms) No.97, Backward Classes, Most Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare Department, dated 17.12.2020, administrative sanction has been accorded to acquire private land through negotiation by following due norms through the District Level Committee headed by the District Collector, for setting up Kabarsthan and Burial ground to bury the dead body of Muslims and Christians.

Further, as per G.O. (Ms) No.15, Backward Classes, Most Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare Department, dated 30.01.2024, orders were issued to implement the scheme to acquire land by district administration for setting up of kabarsthan and burial ground by the Municipal corporation / Municipality in District headquarters where no such grave yard is located. Kabarsthans have been established in 25 District Headquarters and burial grounds have been established in 27 District Headquarters

In the year 2024-2025, Burial ground and Kabarsthan in Perambalur and Tirupathur districts, kabarsthan in Kanniyakumari district have been set up by corporation / municipality. Action is being taken to set up Burial ground and kabarsthan by Corporation/ Municipality in the remaining 14 district headquarters.

Construction and Renovation of Compound Wall and Provision of Pathway for Kabarsthan and Burial Ground

During the year 2023 – 2024, a sum of Rs.1.00 crore has been sanctioned for repairing the damaged compound walls and construction of new compound walls, laying of pathway in burial ground for Christians and Kabarsthan for Muslims.

In order to benefit under this scheme, applications should be submitted to the concerned District Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare Officers/District Minorities Welfare Officers along with estimates. The application will be scrutinized by the District Level Committee under the Chairmanship of the District Collector and sent to the Director of Minorities Welfare with necessary recommendation of the District Collector seeking fund.

In the year 2024-25, a sum of Rs.1.00 crore has been sanctioned for construction of compound wall and pathway to 2 Kabarsthans and 4 Burial Grounds in Cuddalore, Villupuram, Theni, Ariyalur and Chennai districts and the work is in progress.

Prime Minister's New 15 Point Programme

Prime Minister's New 15 Point Programme is being implemented to ensure that the set target reaches minorities under various schemes implemented in Tamil Nadu in proportion to their population of the State.

A State Level Committee under the chairmanship of the Chief Secretary and District Level Committee under the chairmanship of the District Collector have been constituted to monitor and review the schemes implemented by various Departments.

Rehabilitation Assistance

This scheme is implemented to rehabilitate the victims of riots and discharged prisoners convicted for petty offences. Under this scheme, financial assistance upto Rs.10,000 per person is provided for starting small business. So far, a sum of Rs.1.40 lakh has been disbursed to 14 discharged prisoners for petty offences.

Pradhan Mantri Jan Vikas Karyakram (PMJVK)

Pradhan Mantri Jan Vikas karyakram (PMJVK) scheme is aimed at uplifting the socio-economic status of Minorities where they live in large numbers, providing basic amenities to improve their quality of life and reducing inequality. Under this scheme, infrastructural facilities in the fields of education, health and skill development are implemented in the Minority Concentrated Areas identified by the Union Ministry of Minority Affairs as per 2011 census.

As per the revised guidelines of Ministry of Minority Affairs, Government of India, PMJVK will be implemented in all the Districts of Tamil Nadu. The

projects under PMJVK will be proposed where the concentration of Minority population is more than 25% of the total population of the given area (Within 15 km radius).

The fund sharing pattern between Union and State is in the ratio of 60:40. Further 80% of the resources under this programme would be utilized for projects related to priority sector (education, health and skill development) of which at least 33-40 % will be earmarked for creation of assets / facilities for women / girls.

Under this scheme, as per the guidelines of Union Ministry of Minority Affairs, infrastructures like Construction of new schools / Arts and Agriculture colleges, residential schools, additional classrooms in existing Government Schools / Colleges / ITIs / Polytechnics, Providing Computer facilities , Drinking water facility, laboratory, Play ground, smart class, construction of toilets, Construction of School / College Hostels, Construction of new Hospitals / Primary Health Centres, construction of operation theatre in existing Hospital / Primary Health Centres, Intensive Care Unit, In / Out Patient Block, Medical equipment facilities, Stadium, Working women Hostel, Community Halls, Drinking water facility in urban areas and various infrastructural facilities recognized by Ministry of Minority Affairs will be provided in the selected Minority concentrated areas.

Conferment of Minority Status Certificate to Educational Institutions

Orders have been issued in G.O. (Ms) No.109, dated 29.12.2022 for handling subject matter of conferring Minority status to Educational Institutions through this department from 2022. To implement this scheme through online, a separate web portal <https://minoritystatus.tn.gov.in> has been developed and the same is functioning.

The Directorate of Minorities welfare is the Nodal department for applying minority status by Educational Institutions.

Orders have been issued in G.O. (Ms) No.17, dated 02.02.2024 to confer permanent Religious Minority status to Educational Institutions without specifying the period.

Orders have been issued in G.O. (Ms) No.49, dated 22.06.2024 for obtaining certificate from the Revenue Divisional Officer to the effect that Trustees of Educational Institution belongs to the minority community and the same has to be attached while applying for Religious minority status through Online by Educational Institution.

As of now 312 Educational Institutions have been conferred with Minority Status Certificates through this Department. Of these, 246 Educational Institutions have received Permanent Status Certificate.

This scheme is implemented in all the Districts except Chennai District. The Government have ordered to award the incentives to the Girls Students Bank account through DBT from TN-PFTS (Public Fund Tracking System) bank account linked with state scholarship portal from the year 2024-25.

Ulema and Employees Welfare Board

Ulema and Employees Welfare Board was formed and functioning from the year 2009 for the Socio-economic and Educational advancement of Ulemas and other employees.

- The employees working in Mosque, Dargahs, Kabarsthan, Thaikkahs, Ashuarkhana, Muslim orphanages and Aalims working in Madarasa, Pesh Imams, Teachers in Arabic School, Mothinars, Bilals, Mujavar etc., are eligible to register as member and to avail financial assistance.
- If the Member deceased then i) wife / husband ii) children iii) widow daughter and her children come under the list of legal heirs.
- Family means if the member is male, his wife, married or unmarried children, dependent parents, daughter-in-law (widow) son/daughter of the deceased son come under the title 'family'. If the member is female, her husband & children are covered under the title 'family'.
- For Registering as member age should be between 18 to 60 years.
- Identity Card will be given to the registered member of the Board on free of cost.
- Member should renew their ID card once in five years.
- The members registered with the Board are entitled to get Accident Relief, Scholarship, Marriage Assistance, Maternity Assistance and Old Age Pension as provided to the unorganized labours in Welfare Boards functioning under the control of Department of Labour & Employment.

Christian Priests and Church Employees Welfare Board

In the year 2022, Christian Priests and Church Employees Welfare Board has been formed for the educational and economical advancement of Priests and Church Employees working in churches.

To become a member of this Board:-

- Age should be between 18 to 60 years.
- Should belong to Christianity.
- Must have worked for at least seven years in the Church and should submit the certificate obtained from the Administrator of the church or the Village Administrative Officer/Revenue Inspector (Chennai District).
- No welfare assistance will be provided if the member benefitted through some other Welfare Board.
- For availing the benefits, application along with relevant supporting documents should be submitted to the concerned District Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare Officer / District Minorities Welfare Officer.

As per G.O (Ms) No. 27, Backward Classes, Most Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare Department, dated 02.03.2024 Chairman, Vice-Chairman, 9 Ex-officio members and 16 Non Official members have been appointed for a period of 3 years to this Board.

15. Tamil Nadu Minorities Economic Development Corporation

The Tamil Nadu Minorities Economic Development Corporation (TAMCO) was established on 31.08.1999 as a Company under Companies Act, 1956 for the benefit of Minorities viz. Muslims, Christians, Sikhs, Buddhists, Parsis and Jains in Tamil Nadu. The Objective of TAMCO is to provide loans at low rate of interest to Minorities for Self Employment and income generation activities. TAMCO acts as a State Channelizing Agency of National Minorities Finance and Development Corporation (NMDFC), New Delhi.

Loan Schemes

- Individual Loan
- Virasat Scheme (A credit scheme for craft person)
- Micro Credit Loan for self help groups
- Educational Loan

Financing schemes of TAMCO have been segregated into following two categories with differential quantum of loan & interest rates for beneficiaries from different income groups:

Credit Line I - Rs.3.00 lakhs in both urban & rural areas per annum

Credit Line II - Persons who cannot avail benefit under credit line-I and having annual income upto Rs.8,00,000/- (For both Rural and Urban Areas).

If the loan amount exceeds Rs.5.00 lakh, 50% of amount will be released as first installment and the balance amount will be released, after ensuring the loan amount released earlier had been fully utilized for the purpose it was sanctioned.

- The Corporation sanctions loan to individuals and Self Help Groups, District Level Screening Committee selects beneficiaries for various loan schemes. The Corporation sanctions and disburse loans through Co-operative Banks / Societies.
- The Co-Operative Banks will process the loan applications received for sanction of loan. After ensuring the viability of the scheme, eligibility and repaying capacity of the applicant, the applications will be placed before the District Screening Committee headed by Joint Registrar of Co-operative Societies and the Committee will recommended for sanction of loan.

Penal interest

The penal interest will be levied at 5% on loan defaulters along with Principal and interest, and recovered from the Students/Parents/Guardians.

Renewal of education loan

Renewal of Educational loan will be given to the students who have passed in the semester / Non semester examination in the previous year. For renewal of Education loan, the application along with proof of Mark sheet duly attested by the Principal / HOD of the Institution shall be submitted to the Co-Operative Bank for renewal of Education loan.

Repayment of loan

The repayment of the loan amount will commence after 3 months of moratorium period under all schemes (except Education Loan). The loan amount should be repaid in quarterly / monthly basis to the bank depending on the Schemes, as mentioned in the sanction order / Repayment schedule.

The repayment of Education loan will commence from 6 month after completion of course or on getting employment/appointment, whichever is earlier.

Loan limit

- Unsecured loan up to Rs.1.00 lakh
- 100 % collateral should be obtained for loans between Rs.1,00,001 to Rs.5,00,000/-
- Tuition fees, hostel fees and food charges for the courses, Laboratory fee. Loan will be given along with fees including book fee.

16. Tamil Nadu State Minorities Commission

The Tamil Nadu State Minorities Commission was constituted to safeguard the interest of religious and linguistic Minorities of Tamil Nadu in 1989. It was conferred with Statutory Powers as per Tamil Nadu State Minorities Commission Act, 2010 (Act 21/2010) with effect from 01.08.2010.

The present Commission was reconstituted in the year 2024 for a period of 3 years.

Functions of the Commission

- i. Implementation of the various safeguards provided in the Constitution of India and in the laws enacted by the State Legislature for the protection of Minorities.
- ii. To make recommendation for the effective implementation of all the safeguards provided for minorities in a proper manner.
- iii. To undertake a review of the implementation of the policies taken by the Government and Welfare Schemes for the welfare of Minorities.
- iv. To conduct studies, research and analysis on the question of removal of discrimination against Minorities.
- v. To suggest appropriate legal measures to be taken to protect the interest of minorities and Welfare measures to be implemented for their development to the State Government.
- vi. To make recommendations on the methods for ensuring, maintaining and promoting communal harmony in the State.

Activities of the Commission

The State Minorities Commission receives representation from the members of the Minority Communities and Minority Institutions. They call petitioners to hear the problems and get reports from the Government Departments on the issues and genuine grievances raised by them. The Commission also visits various districts in the State to study the problems of the Minorities and if necessary, recommend suitable measures to the

Government for ensuring implementation of the schemes for the welfare of Minorities.

The District Collectors were instructed to take action on the Welfare schemes of Directorate of Minorities Welfare and listen to the demands of the Minorities.

State Level Minorities Rights Day

State Level Minorities Rights Day was celebrated on 18th December, 2024 at Tiruchirappalli district and District level functions were also held in all the districts.

17. Tamil Nadu Waqf Board

In accordance with Central Waqf Act 1954, the Tamil Nadu Waqf Board was constituted on 18.01.1958. The Board is constituted once in 5 years as per Waqf Act, 1995 (Central Act 43/1995) and the present Board is functioning with 12 Members.

1. Establishment:

The Chief Executive Officer is the Administrative head. For the efficient administration throughout the State of Tamil Nadu, the office is having 11 zonal offices at Chennai, Poonamallee, Vellore, Panrutti, Salem, Coimbatore, Thanjavur, Trichy, Madurai, Ramanathapuram and Tirunelveli. Each zone is headed by one Superintendent.

2. Functions Of The Board

- a) To maintain a record containing information relating to the origin, income, object and beneficiaries of every Waqf.
- b) To ensure that the income and other properties of the Waqfs are applied to the objects and for the purposes for which such Waqfs were created or intended.
- c) To give directions for the administration of the Waqf.
- d) To settle scheme of management for Waqfs.
- e) To scrutinize and approve the Budget submitted by Muthawallis and to arrange for the auditing of the accounts of the Waqfs.
- f) To appoint and remove Muthawallis in accordance with the provisions of the Waqf Act.
- g) To take measures for the recovery of the lost properties of Waqfs.
- h) To institute and defend suits and proceedings in a Court of law relating to Waqfs, and their properties.
- i) To administer the Waqf fund.

- j) To call for such returns, statistics, accounts and other information from the Muthawallis with respect to the Waqf properties as the Board may require from time to time.
- k) To inspect or cause inspection of Waqf properties, accounts or records or deeds and documents relating thereto;
- l) To investigate and determine the nature and extent of Waqfs and Waqf properties and to cause, whenever necessary, survey of Waqf properties;
- m) To do generally all such acts as may be necessary for the due control, maintenance and administration of Waqfs.

Apart from this, the Board is implementing certain schemes for the needy Waqf institutions such as Renovation scheme for the repair and renovation of Waqf properties, Major Renovation Scheme, Scheme for construction of compound wall / barbed wire fencing around Burial Ground, Ulema pension Scheme, Ulema Family Pension Scheme. There are 6642 Waqf Institutions under the supervisory control of Tamil Nadu Waqf Board out of which, 3253 are registered waqfs and 3389 are unregistered waqfs. There are 24 waqfs are registered during the year 2024-2025.

3.Constitution of Waqf Tribunal

As per section 83 of the Waqf Act, 1995 for determination of any disputes relating to waqf or waqf properties, the Government of Tamil Nadu constituted Tamil Nadu Waqf Tribunal in the year 2018 at Chennai.

The Waqf Tribunal is functioning in the office complex at Door No.5, Kamarajar Salai, Chennai – 600 005 from 06.08.2018.

It consists of a District Sessions or Civil Judge as the Chairman, an officer from the State Civil Services and a person having knowledge of Muslim law and Jurisprudence as Members.

4. Sanction of Administrative Grant by the Government:

Every year, the State Government sanctions Administrative Grant of Rs.2.5 Crores to Tamil Nadu Waqf Board. Orders were issued for sanction of incentive at the rate of 5% as additional Administrative Grant based on the contribution collected by the Tamil Nadu Waqf Board from the year 2022-2023 onwards.

5. Honorarium to Kazis:

The Government of Tamil Nadu is paying honorarium of Rs.20,000/- per month to Kazis working in the Tamil Nadu from the year 2018.

18. Tamil Nadu State Haj Committee

Constitution of the Committee:

Haj Committee Act, 2002 was enacted by the Government of India to make arrangements pertaining to travel and accommodation to the Haj pilgrims visiting Makkah/Madinah at Saudi Arabia. As per the provisions containing of the said Act, the Tamil Nadu State Hajj Committee is periodically reconstituted for a period of 3 years. The present Committee was reconstituted by the Government during the year 2023 with 16 members. Thiru. M.A. Siddique, I.A.S. has been appointed as Ex-officio Member of the Committee by the Government. Thiru Abdul Samath, MLA has been elected as the Chairman of this committee.

Functions of the Tamil Nadu State Hajj Committee:

- (i) Based on the guidelines of Ministry of Minority Affairs, Government of India, the Haj Committee of India, Mumbai, State Haj Committee accepts Haj Applications from the intending pilgrims through online only.
- (ii) Receipt of applications and selection of applicants for Haj pilgrimage from Tamil Nadu, by draw of lots using computer software when the number of applications is more than the quota.
- (iii) Issue of advice to the applicants regarding payment of passage fare and other dues to the Haj Committee of India, Mumbai.
- (iv) Deputation of representatives to the Building Selection Team to assist Consulate General of India to select suitable buildings.
- (v) Deputation of Haj volunteers to Saudi Arabia every year to look after the welfare of the Hajis from Tamil Nadu.
- (vi) To liaise with the Regional Passport Offices for obtaining (Haj) passports for the intending Haj pilgrims, if necessary.
- (vii) Printing and supply of hand book on 'Haj and Umrah' at free of cost in Tamil language every year to Haj pilgrims.
- (viii) To coordinate the functions relating to various agencies of Government of India, State Government, the Haj Committee of India, Mumbai and other agencies such as Saudi Arabian Airlines, Air India, Airports Authority of India, Immigration, Customs, BCAS, etc., and other voluntary organisations for smooth, hassle free and successful arrangements for Haj flight operations, etc.

- (ix) To provide supporting arrangements for operation of direct Haj flights from Chennai to Jeddah and back such as transit accommodation, transport from accommodation centres to airport and back, etc.
- (x) To conduct inoculation camps and orientation programmes at various district/taluk headquarters benefitting the pilgrims.
- (xi) Other incidental activities relating to Haj pilgrimage.

Procedure for application:

Every year, before the commencement of Haj period, the Haj Committee of India, Mumbai in consultation with Ministry of Minority Affairs, New Delhi, finalize the various proposals relating to Hajj pilgrimage. Based on the instructions of Haj Committee of India, Mumbai, a press release is issued every year by the Tamil Nadu State Hajj Committee calling for applications for Haj pilgrimage. The last date for submission of the filled in applications is also notified by the Haj Committee of India. The Government of India allots pilgrims quota for each State based on the Muslim population of each State. If the number of applications received is more than the State quota, the Haj pilgrims are selected through the drawing lots in a transparent manner. Haj Application Form can be submitted online at **www.hajcommittee.gov.in**. For further details, intending haj applicants may refer to the guidelines for Haj 2025 issued by Haj Committee of India, Mumbai in the website address **www.hajcommittee.gov.in**.

Arrangements for Haj pilgrimage:

(a) Haj quota for each State.

The Government of India distributes the quota allotted for the country among various States based on Muslim population as per 2011 census. The Tamil Nadu State Hajj Committee invites applications from the intending pilgrims. The pilgrims are selected directly by the Haj Committee of India, Mumbai/ Ministry of Minority Affairs by holding district wise Qurrah (draw of lots) as per the quota allotted for Tamil Nadu.

(b) Orientation Training camps.

A comprehensive orientation/training programme is conducted for the pilgrims at District level to educate the intending pilgrims on the various travel formalities and rituals to be observed while performing Hajj/Umrah and about the difficulties they would likely face during the pilgrimage and services offered by various departments like Consulate General of India, Jeddah, Moallims, etc. The extensive orientation programmes are carried out through Tamil Nadu State Hajj Committee at district level is found very useful by the pilgrims. The Trainers as trained by Hajj Committee of India, Mumbai are deputed to the various centres where training camps are organised with the help of local voluntary organisations and members of the Committee and intending pilgrims are educated by these trainers. Visuals are also shown in these programmes for better understanding by the pilgrims and to avoid difficulties during the course of their journey.

(c) Inoculation camps.

Tamil Nadu State Hajj Committee conducts inoculation programme against meningitis and seasonal influenza all the districts of Tamil Nadu. The above vaccines are administered to the pilgrims before every Hajj and National Institute of Communicable Diseases, New Delhi supplies the vaccines to all State Hajj Committees free of cost. The required doses of the Tetra vaccine and seasonal Influenza are distributed to the Deputy Directors of Health Services in all the districts through King Institute, Chennai. The staff of the Committee are deputed to various centres to conduct the inoculation programme as per the dates fixed by the Committee. Vaccination is administered free of cost.

It is mandatory to give Oral Polio vaccine to all the pilgrims six weeks before start of their Hajj journey. Accordingly, this Committee arranges for administering of Polio drops to the pilgrims through Public Health authorities

and Corporation of Chennai. Certificates in this regard will also be issued to the pilgrims.

Grants/assistance from State Government:

a) Administrative Grant for the Committee.

The Government of Tamil Nadu sanctions a sum of Rs.50 lakh as administrative grant every year to the Haj Committee towards payment of salaries to staff, settlement of charges like property tax, electricity charges, metro water and sewerage charges, etc. During the year 2024-2025, the Government has enhanced the annual administrative grant to Tamil Nadu State Hajj Committee from Rs.50 lakh to Rs.80 lakh.

b) State Government Haj subsidy.

In order to fulfil one of the five religious obligations of the Muslims, the Government of Tamil Nadu has been implementing a scheme of providing subsidy to the pilgrims of Tamil Nadu who are performing Haj pilgrimage for the first time. Accordingly, a sum of Rs.25,000/- per pilgrim will be deposited to haj pilgrim's bank account directly before proceeding haj pilgrimage for haj 2025.

c) Sanction of grant for deputation of Haj volunteers.

The Government also sanctions grants to the Tamil Nadu State Hajj Committee to meet expenditure on deputation of Haj volunteers to Saudi Arabia who assist the haj pilgrims. During the year Haj 2024, 28 Haj volunteers were deputed to Saudi Arabia to assist the pilgrims of Tamil Nadu. Under this scheme, a sum of Rs.54.99 lakh was sanctioned as grant to Tamil Nadu State Hajj Committee for the year 2024-2025.

d) Other grants

The Government also sanctions expenditure towards T.A./D.A. bills of Chairman / members of Tamil Nadu State Hajj Committee in respect of their

visits to attend meeting conducted by Hajj Committee of India, Ministry of Minorities Affairs and Airport authority of India of the Committee.
